IMPORTANT UPCOMING VOTE!

On March 20, 2007, Fulton citizens will vote on whether to continue the Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) for an additional five years. SPLOST is a one-cent tax on every dollar spent in Fulton County. The money is used by the school system to fund new schools, additions to existing schools, technology upgrades, and equipment and buses.

Fulton County first approved SPLOST in 1997, with a renewal approved in 2002. Since it began 10 years ago, the penny tax has funded 29 new schools and 18 school additions. SPLOST helps keep our property taxes low. Anyone who makes a purchase in Fulton County helps to fund our schools. Think of all the people that go to sporting events, the Aquarium, or restaurants in Atlanta. SPLOST is the least expensive way to pay for the many necessary capital improvements.

The two big improvements scheduled for Centennial are a new classroom wing with a music room and artificial turf in the stadium.
